publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking
all wills by me at any time heretofore made, and
first I commit my soul to God, give it and my
worldly estate I dispose of as follows.

1st I desire that my funeral expenses & all my debts should be paid.
2nd I will and bequeath unto my beloved son Robert L. Wilson
two notes of bond on Loretta A. Smith of Randolph
County in this State for one thousand dollars each
the first due the first day of January 1871 and the
other due the first day of January 1872 and I further
will and bequeath to the children of my son R. L.
Wilson all that he now owns me or may owe me at
my death www.georgiapioneers.com by him and distributed
to them as he thinks best as they come of age or marry.

3th I will and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Sarah
S. Mibuchan one hundred interest in a note I hold
on Loretta A. Smith of Randolph County in this
State for Eight hundred dollars due the 1st day of
January 1873 to have to her own use and not subject to
the control of her present or any future husband.

4th I will and bequeath unto my beloved grand children
James D. W. Brinkert, Thomas D., Robert M., William D., and
all my home place lying about one mile from
Pine, known as the S. M. Wilson place consisting
lots of land containing 120 acres more or less
to Original Survey to be divided as follows
is to have the lot of land on which I now live
all the improvements it being more profitable
as the other tracts and also give
Porter's lot of land

lot also the Cotton gin Wagon & formerly utensils,
I will & desire that Thomas D. shall have the old
Settlement on the Parichard lot with all the improve-
ments there except that portion which will go to J. & W. Humbert
except such portion as may fall to M. M. Humbert in
division of said lot, and the lot known as the
Treasure lot which I will and desire should be
divided agreeable between the said J. M. & M. M. Humbert.
This D. holding the improvements on the
Parichard lot, and I further will and desire that the
said J. D. M. & D. & M. M. should pay to Martha B. Hum-
bert one thousand dollars with interest at seven
per cent. for her interest in said lots of land
to be paid by each one agreeable to the value
of each one share and on their failing to do so
she is to have one fourth of said lots of land
and I further will and desire that Martha B.
Humbert have my Piano, all my stock of cotton
and all my house hold and kitchen furniture
except a bed a pair for J. D. M. This D. M. M. & my
grand daughter Juffy Fain, & further I will and
desire that J. D. W. Humbert have my cash Col-
lection & that M. B. Humbert have my cash Col-
lection.

Martha Solo Wilson have fifty dollars each in cash
and I further will and desire that Robert D. Wilson
& J. D. Humbert shall be my
