said land for the lifetime of the said Emily
in Commore to share and share alike in all
the profits and issues arising therefrom and at
the death of my wife the said lands are to be the
sole property of the said William B. Gray and his
heirs at law.

Item 4th I will to my dear wife Emily Gray my home
place No 315 in the 9th District and 3rd Section
of said County for and during her natural life
conditioned as follows, that my beloved daughter in
law Nancy E. Gray wife of John Gray died is to live
where she now does and to have the privilege of
cultivating any of said lot No 315 that she may
see fit: and at the death of my beloved wife Emily
the said Nancy E. is to have said lot free from
all incumbrances as her own right & property.

Item 5th I will my daughter in law Mary E. Gray wife
of Thomas E. Gray died for and during her natural

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life all of lot of land numbered 47 in the 8th land
 District and 3rd Section of Spick Creek with the
 following restrictions and conditions to wit: that
 my beloved son William H Gray have the entire
 Control of said lot of land, and to manage it as
 to be of the best advantage to the said Mary &
 and if the said Mary & should become dis-
 satisfied that the said W H Gray sell the said lot of
 land and use the money arising from the sale
 in the purchase of other lands as a home for
 the said Mary & Gray

I hereby appoint my beloved wife Mary Gray &
 my beloved son William H Gray my sole executor to
 carry out this my last will in full effect.
