equally among those who have no land, now residing
in Murray County.

Item 4th My land on the river, ever east and the
belong to be divided as they may see proper my son
Dove to have my share.

seal this the twenty fourth (24) day of January 1871.
Eighteen hundred and seventy one. I further add to
this, that it is my will that my son David be my
Executor,
