in the State of Georgia together with all the personal
property, except one servid filly and my saddle, I
bequeath to my grandson J. C. Walker, also I bequeath
to my daughter Sarah S. Walker, which said
more is unfolded at this time, now possessed by me
during the term of her natural life and after her
death to be divided equally among my heirs, the
before mentioned part of lot of land No 55-10 dis-
trict 3rd Section of Murray, in the State of Georgia
after the death of my wife to be sold to my son
Samuel in cash and my son Samuel to pay all the
balance of my heirs their equitable share of said
land sold in cash. Likewise.

I make constitute and appoint my son Samuel Walker
and my wife Elizabeth Executors and Administrators of this
my last will and testament.
