

In the name of God Amen, I Susan Stewart of the County of Murray and State of Georgia being of sound and disposing mind and memory & being desirous to settle my worldly affairs which I have strength so to do, do make and publish this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all wills by me at any time heretofore made. And first I Commit my soul to the God who gave it; and my body I desire to be buried by the side of my husband in the graveyard at Pleasant Valley Church in said County and my worldly Estate I dispose of as follows.

First I will & desire that all my just debts be paid.
Second I will and bequeath to my son James L Stewart and to my daughters, Mary G Jackson, Malissa A. Sebastian, and Mary Ann all that I have heretofore done for them or have given.

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Third I will and bequeath to my sons Sampson L Stewart and Franklin M Stewart, and my daughter Louisa Jane Stewart and Susan C Stewart all my Cows and killing hogs, two cows & colts all my house hold and kitchen furniture which is to belong to them in common as long as they remain together & when they separate to be equally divided between them, except my rifle gun, which I will and bequeath to my son Franklin M Stewart and further, and I will and bequeath to Sampson L Stewart one Colt known as his Colt.

Fourth I will and desire that the remainder of my property be sold to the highest bidder and after paying all my just debts, I will & bequeath all that may be left from the proceeds of said sale to be equally divided between

my four last named children.
 I, the said, I will and desire, and do hereby constitute
 and appoint John Bates of said County my
 lawful Executor to execute this my last will
 and testament. In witness whereof I the said
 Susan Stewart have to this my will consisting
 of one sheet of paper set my hand & seal
 this 28th day of November 1860.
