I Andrew P. Jones of said State and County, do ordain publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking all others by me heretofore made

Item 1st My Soul I commend to God who gave it, my body I desire to be buried in such manner as my Executors may designate -

Item 2^d After the payment of my funeral expenses, and any just debts I may be owing at the time of my death, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Wm. J. Ann Jones all the balance of my property real and personal of every description for her sole use and benefit for and during her natural life, and at her death the remainder of said property to be equally divided between my children shan and shan alike, the children of any of my deceased children taking the share to which their parents would be entitled if living

Item 3^d I nominate and appoint my said Wife Executrix and my son in Law Peter Puer Executor of this my last will and testament

In Testimony whereof I the said Andrew P. Jones have hereto set my hand and affixed my seal in the presence of the subscribing witnesses this sixth day of December 1865 -

Mrs. Anna Davie's Will

State of Georgia Muscogee County

I, Anna Davie, being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make this my last will and testament of all my worldly affairs hereby revoking all other wills by me ever made

Item 1st I wish my body to be decently buried by my children and relations in such manner as they may see fit, my Immortal Spirit to God who gave it relying upon his goodness and mercy

Item 2^d I will that all my just debts be paid

Item 3^d I give to my son Pleasant G. Philips one Bedstead, Bed & Bedding out of that I now have on hand, and two Bonds with Coupons annexed, on the Mobile and Girard Rail Road of Alabama guaranteed by the Central Rail Road and Banking Company of the State of Georgia, the principal amount of each calls for One Thousand and Dollars, No^o One Hundred and Twenty Seven (127) and One Hundred and Twenty Eight (128) Also a Bond No^o One Hundred and Sixty Six (166) of the City of Columbus Georgia issued to the North and South Rail Road of the State of Georgia for One
