I, Annie Euphrosia Ellington of Muscogee County and State aforesaid, do make and declare this to be my Last Will and Testament

First I give and bequeath to my beloved sister Violet Belle Ellington all my property of every kind, that I may die seized and possessed of at the time of my death, (except Five Thousand Dollars) during her natural life, and at her death to be equally divided between her said children, to be free from the control or from the debts of any husband she may have, if she should die leaving no children then the property to return to my estate.

Second I give the Five Thousand Dollars reserved in the above clause to my Uncle Simon C. Ellington.

Third and in the event of the property which I have given to my sister returning to my estate, I give and bequeath in the following manner: To my friend Sarah Cunningham One Thousand Dollars for her own proper use and benefit not subject to the debts of any husband she may ever have.

I give and bequeath to my friend Annie — my One Thousand Dollars for her own proper use and benefit not subject to the debts of any husband she may ever have.

I give and bequeath to Jane Ellington — a former slave One ~~Thousand~~ Hundred Dollars (\$100)

The balance of the property with the increase that may come to me through my sister Violet Belle Ellington or from any other source, I wish to be equally divided between my Aunt Euphrosia Reed, my Uncle Simon C. Ellington and my Aunt Victoria Daniel, the amount I give to my Aunt Euphrosia Reed to be free from the debts or control of her present husband or any future husband she may have the amount I give to my Aunt Victoria Daniel to be hers free from the debts or control of her present husband or any future husband she may have, and if she dies without children then in that event, the property I wish and desire should go to Samuel Clark Daniel son of Oliver P. Daniel.

Sattly, I hereby constitute and appoint Isaac R. Hall of Greensboro Ga. Executor of this my Last Will and Testament. This 27 day of August 1866

Before me, the Ordinary of said County at Chambers personally came James W. Godkin & John A. Miller two of the subscribing Witnesses to the within and foregoing Last Will and Testament of Annie Euphrosia Ellington decd who upon oath say that they all reside & still do reside in Greene County at this time, that said Annie Euphrosia Ellington at the time of her death was a citizen of Muscogee County and that she died in Europe, and that her said Last Will and Testament was executed in said County of Greene, State aforesaid, that they saw the Testatrix said Annie Euphrosia Ellington sign, seal and heard her publish and declare the same as her Last Will and Testament freely, voluntarily and of her own accord, and without any compulsion whatever, that at the time of the execution of said Last Will and Testament was of sound and disposing mind and memory, that they subscribed the same as Witnesses in the presence of each other and in the presence of the Testatrix and at her special instance and request.
