In the name of God Amen

I, Chancy Shivers of the County and State of Georgia being of sound and disposing mind and memory, and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs, while I have strength to do so, do make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all wills by me at any time heretofore made. And first I commit my soul to God who gave it, and my body I desire to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner, and my worldly Estate I dispose of as follows

Item 1st I desire all my just debts to be paid

Item 2^d I give and bequeath the lot on which I am now living, it being bounded on the north by a lot owned by Lucius Jones a freedman, on the west by a lot owned by the Estate of Beaborn Jones deceased, on the south by a lot owned by Lucius Jones, and on the East by the road which leads to Camp Mountgimery, to ~~the~~ my sisters Betty Turner and Nancy Lowe both freedwomen, and my grand child Henry Hurdaway freedwoman

Chaney Thiers Will and Testament

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Item 3 I constitute and appoint James I. Abercrombie my Executor of this my last will and testament, and I do not wish the legatus or distributurs under the will, and I do not wish myself to oblige him to give bond and security as my Executor, as it may not and probably will not be necessary to do any thing but deliver my house and the lot on which I am now living to said legatus and distributurs

Item 4 I give and bequeath to the above named parties all my household and kitchen furniture, and personal property of all kind I mean my retatives
