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Georgia Muscogee County - On this 6th day of October 1865 in vacation in person comes before me ~~the undersigned~~ ^{the undersigned} ~~John M King~~ ^{John M King} John M King who being sworn on oath say that they were present when Thomas Cannak then in life but now deceased executed the foregoing writing that at the time of executing the same he was of sound & disposing mind and memory that he declared the same to be his last will and that he signed the same in the presence of deponents & that they deponents subscribed their names as witnesses in the presence of the testator & in presence of each other.

Deponents further say that so far as they know or believe said testator executed said will freely of his own accord without any undue influence or compulsion

On 1st I will first that having committed my soul to God the giver of all good that my body be decently buried & that all my just debts be immediately paid

On 2nd I give unto my wife Mary Pace the following negroes to wit Thom, Old Ned, Sam, Lester, Caroline & her two children to wit Eliza Ann & Martha, Mary Jane & her five children to wit Richard, Mary, Anna, Sally and Gabriel & Maria's

 two children to wit Henry & Seaborn to have & to hold to him &
 assigns for ever

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Item 3rd I will unto my wife Mary Pace for her use & benefit during her life the following negroes to wit Henry the Blacksmith, Young Ned, Custome, William, Zack, Jim, Mary, Adeline, Bill & his wife Lizzie, Charity, Riley, Francis & his children Joe & Andrew with their income and at her death said negroes with their income to go to & become the property of my brother Elkanah Pace his heirs & assigns forever

Item 4th I give unto Martha Jane Crook the following negroes to wit Charles, Charity, Mark, Edmund, Sarah, Jane, Arctic, John, Sol, Creasy, Rachel, Margaret & Ellen. One lot of land which I purchased from McNeil one bay mare & colt and cow & calf & six head of sheep to have & to hold to her & her heirs & assigns forever

Item 5th I will unto my wife Mary Pace for her use & benefit during her life the remainder of my estate to wit Lands, Mules, Horses, Hogs, Cattle & whatever else may remain or be. And at her death to go to & become the property of my brother Elkanah Pace his heirs & assigns forever

Item 6th I will unto my brother Elkanah Pace my distribution share & my deceased brother William Pace's distribution share in my dec'd Father's (William Pace) estate to him & his heirs to have & hold forever

Item 7th I hereby constitute & appoint my brother Elkanah Pace the Executor of this my last will & testament with full power to execute the same On testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal on this seventh day of July 1864
