Item 3^d I will unto my wife Mary Pace for her use & benefit during her life the following negroes to wit Henry the Blacksmith, Young Ned, Gustavus, William, Zack, Jim, Mary, Adaline, Bill & his wife Lizzie, Charity, Riley, Frances & her children for & Andrew with their increase and at her death said negroes with their increase to go to & become the property of my brother Elkanah Pace his heirs & assigns forever

Item 4th I give unto Martha Jane Crutch the following negroes to wit Charles, Charity, Mark, Edmund, Sarah, Jane, Dettie, John, Sol, Creamy, Rachel, Margaret & Ellen. One lot of land which I purchased from McNeil one bay mare & colt and cow & calf & six head of sheep to have & to hold to her & her heirs & assigns forever

Item 5th I will unto my wife Mary Pace for her use & benefit during her life the remainder of my Estate to wit Land, Mules, Horses, Wags, Cattle & whatsoever else may remain or be. And at her death to go to & become the property of my brother Elkanah Pace his heirs and assigns forever

Item 6th I will unto my brother Elkanah Pace my distributive share & my deceased brother William Pace's distributive share in my deceased Father's (William Pace) estate to him & his heirs to have & hold forever

Item 7th I hereby constitute & appoint my brother Elkanah Pace the Executor of this my last will & testament with full power to execute the same. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal on this seventh day of July 1864

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Know Ye that on the sixth day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred & sixty five the last will and testament of Clement Pace late of said County deceased was exhibited in open court and in common form of law proved & admitted to record a copy of which is herewith annexed and administration of the estate real & personal of said deceased was granted to Elkanah Pace the Executor in & by said will named & appointed he having first taken the oath and performed all other requisites required by law in & by order of said Court & by virtue of these presents legally authorized to administer the estate real & personal of the said deceased according to the tenor & effect of the said will & testament according to law And he is hereby required to render a true and perfect inventory of all the estate both real & personal of the said deceased and have the same appraised & returned to this Court according to law and to render a true & correct account to the said Court of his actings & doings yearly and every year until this administration is fully completed
