Daniel Huff's Will

I Daniel Huff of the county of Muscogee & State of Georgia being of sound mind & memory and being advanced in age and thereby admonished that my remaining days upon earth can not be long do make public and declare this to be my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore made

Item 1st My soul I commend to God who gave it - my body I wish to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my executor & surviving friends

Item 2nd I give bequeath & devise to my beloved wife Estlin A Huff the place and Champion place containing about two hundred acres of land with all the appurtenances thereto belonging - one good horse & buggy or mule instead of horse if preferred - two cows and calves two sows & pigs two beds of furniture one sewing machine with a sufficient quantity of household & kitchen furniture for her use also a sufficient amount of provisions for herself and the live stock hereby bequeathed to her for the space of twelve months - also the sum of two hundred dollars in money - Provided my said wife shall accept the bequest & devise contained in this item in lieu of dower and not otherwise

Samuel Huffs Will (continued)

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The property herein bequeathed and devised to my said wife shall be for her use and benefit during her life and after death the remainder thereof to become the property of my son Warren Huffs

Item 3rd Give to my son Warren Huffs in trust & confidence for the use benefit & behoof of my two grand sons Joseph Haniel Huffs & Watson Huffs sons of my said son Warren Huffs all the stock down in the Muscogee Rail Road Company to be equally divided between them my said grand sons share & share alike

Item 4th All the residue & remainder of my estate real personal & mixed money, debts due me and to become due claims in action & every thing of value which right fully belongs to me whether in my possession or not Give bequeath & devise to my said son Warren Huffs to him his heirs & assigns forever. My estate having been very much reduced by the calamities of the late war and having hitherto given my other children property I consider what is hereby given to Warren not more than his equitable portion under all the circumstances

Item 5th I hereby nominate constitute & appoint my son Warren Huffs Executor of this my last Will & testament with full power to execute the same without giving any bond or security - and it is my desire and so advise that my beloved wife live with my said son Warren and that he manage the real estate hereby devised to my said wife believing that by so doing it will be for their mutual convenience & benefit provided it shall be pleasant for them to dwell together in love but if it should be otherwise it is my will & desire that wife shall have the means of support & a comfortable residence

In the second item of this will the land given to my wife as the "Holt and Champion place" means the land once owned by men of those names and is well known in my family & the neighborhood - when the Wilson Raid went through the county my title papers were destroyed or carried off
