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State of Georgia } I, Daniel Rogers of the State and
 Muscogee County } County, do make and publish this as
 my Last will and Testament -

Item 1st - I give and bequeath to my son Anthony L. Rogers, in trust, for the wife of my said son, Martha Ann Rogers, all of my lands and real estate of every description lying and being in the County of Lee, in the State of Alabama - And it is my will that my said son, Anthony L. Rogers shall hold the same in trust for the use and benefit of the said Martha Ann Rogers for and during her natural life, and at her death to become the property of the said Anthony L. Rogers - And I do hereby constitute and appoint my said son Anthony L. Rogers, the Executor of this my last Will and Testament - And as I have sufficient property in the State of Georgia, to pay all my just debts, I desire the said debts to be paid out of my other property, so as to leave the above bequest unincumbered, and for the purposes aforesaid -

And it is further my will, that my said son so appointed Executor and Trustee as aforesaid, shall not be required to give any Bond and Security either as Executor or as Trustee as aforesaid -

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and do hereby publish the same as my last Will and Testament - Signed, published, and declared as my Last Will, in the presence of the undersigned Witnesses, who do hereby subscribe the same in the presence of the Testator, and in the presence of each other, this 23rd day of Nov. 1868 -
