2 I David Hudson of the city of Columbus, County of Muscogee and State of Georgia, being of sound mind and memory, but failing in physical health, and being desirous of settling my worldly affairs, while yet able to do so, do make and publish this my last and testament and

First I commit my soul to god who gave it, and I direct that my worldly Estate be disposed of as follows-

Item 1st I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Leila Hudson the lot of land with the improvements thereon in the City of Columbus, known in the plan of said City as Number Three Hundred and twenty five (325) situate on the North East corner of Jackson and Randolph Streets, the same being the place wherein I now reside, the same to be, and remain the sole and separate property of my said wife Leila, to her and her heirs forever, only subject to the following trust that my said wife Leila, shall during the lifetime of my son William furnish to him the said William a good and comfortable home in the premises herein bequeathed and devised to her by this item of my will

Item 2^d I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Leila Hudson, all the residue and remainder of my Estate, real, personal and mixed, but direct, that the property devised and bequeathed by this item of my will, shall be charged with the support and maintenance of my said son William for and during his natural life, under the direction of my said wife Leila and I do hereby constitute and appoint my wife Leila Hudson Guardian of the person and property of my said son William Hudson

Item 3^d I do hereby nominate and appoint my wife Leila Hudson sole Executing of this my last will and testament

In witness whereof I the said David Hudson to this my last will and testament have set my hand and affixed my seal this the Fourth day of March 1873.
