I Fannie A Davis of the County of Muscogee and state of Georgia being of sound and disposing mind and memory, and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs while I have strength so to do do make and publish this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all Wills by me made at any time heretofore. And first, I commit my soul to God who gave it, and my body I desire to be buried in the family burial ground in the Cemetery of in the City of Columbus and County aforesaid, and my worldly Estate I dispose of as follows

First- for the great love and affection I entertain for my daughter Laura E. A. Milford wife of Robert W. Milford all of the said County and State, I do give bequeath and devise all my estate, both real and personal to my said daughter Laura E. A. Milford wife of Robert W. Milford, to wit, all my undivided half interest in two certain town or City lots in the City of Columbus and County and state aforesaid known and distinguished as lots number Five Hundred and Eighty Nine (#589) in the plan of said City containing one half acre more or less, and the south half of lot number Four Hundred and Two (#402) containing one quarter of an acre more or less, to have and to hold the same for her own proper use benefit and behoof forever. second, I do hereby constitute and appoint Robert W. Milford Executor to administer and execute the provisions of this my last will and Testament

In witness whereof, I the said Fannie A Davis to this my will consisting of the foregoing sheet of paper comprising this the second page have set my hand and seal this ^{22nd} day of September 1871
