I Francis Wacasser of the State of Alabama County of Russell being in good health of body and of sound and disposing mind and memory and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs which I have standing and capacity do by do. do make and publish this my last will and testament. here by revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made

Impressis

I direct my Executors herein after to be named shall see all funeral expenses and charges connected therewith including physicians fees, should any be incurred, to be promptly paid, and I be decently buried in the City of Columbus State of Georgia and that a suitable and appropriate tombstone be erected to my memory, After payment of my just debts and charges I dispose of my estate as follows. First in order that the devised and bequests herein after to be mentioned may be fully executed it is my will that my Executor or Executors as soon as conveniently may be after my decease dispose of so much of my estate whether real or personal as to give to my sons William Frederick and Louis Edward and my daughter Henrietta Ophelia Children by my first husband Henry Schneider and Georgia Pauline and Mary Sophronia Children by my second husband George H. Wacasser three hundred Dollars each in good and lawful currency. To my sons William Frederick and Louis Edward I devise the money to be given absolutely, but to my daughters Henrietta Ophelia Georgia Pauline and Mary Sophronia who are married I devise that their shares be given in trust or otherwise so that they may enjoy the sole use and benefit thereof, but under no circumstances be liable for the debt or debts that either now are or may hereafter be contracted by their respective husbands. Provided also and my further will is that in case either of my said daughters shall before my death or at any period there after become a widow then the same course shall be pursued towards said widowed daughters or daughters as towards my sons William and Edward and the money paid to them directly. The residue and remainder of all my estate both real and personal not herein otherwise provided for or disposed of it is my will that my Executor or Executors see and

divide into equal shares giving to each of my children
namely Louis & Charles, Albert, William, Edward,
Ophelia Pauline and Mary share and share alike
This disposition I have made for the reason that
during my life I have given to my three eldest
children viz Louis, Charles, and Albert as much
if not more than the sum named in the first
clause of this my will, first to be paid out of
my estate to the said William, Edward, Ophelia
Pauline and Mary. And further it is my will that
in any case any person or persons to whom any
legacy or benefit out of from or by reason of this
my will shall commence any suit or suits in
any Court of law or equity or other Court where-
ever, or by any ways or means sue and disturb
my Executors herein after to be named, or any person
or persons whatsoever to whom any thing is by me
given in this my will from the recovering quiet
enjoying and possessing is by me given as aforesaid
and in such manner as is therein mentioned:
then my will and meaning is that all and every
the legacy or legacies herein given by me to any
such person or persons whatsoever, who shall
so sue and disturb as aforesaid shall cease deter-
mine and be utterly void and that there and from
thenceforth I do give and bequeath the legacy or
legacies, which I had in this my will given to
such child or children, to be equally divided among
those others who remain quiet and abide by this
my will. And I do hereby nominate constitute
and appoint Thomas J. Edwards and Freeman
Stewart Executors of this my last will & Testament
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this the 21st day of September A.D. 1870
