Grigsby & Thomas' nuncupative Will
Columbus Ga July 4th 1865

This is the last will & testament of me Grigsby & Thomas of the county of Muscogee & of the State of Georgia

Here first I do will & direct that the following landed property belonging rightfully to me viz Six hundred acres or thereabouts in the Counties of La Fayette & Pontotoc Mississippi one half undivided interest in a quarter Section near Silver Run Alabama a lot in formerly Early County Georgia and the Mill tract in Chattahoochee County Georgia containing about twelve hundred acres be sold at the discretion of my Executors and the proceeds be first appropriated to the payment of my just debts

Here second I give & bequeath to my son Grigsby my law-library & office furniture

Here third I bequeath to my wife Mrs Elizabeth A Thomas the tract of land upon which my residence is situated with all of its appurtenances and all of the property thereon together with my woodland tract containing about twenty three acres more or less during her life time It is my wish that my neighbor and friend J C Cook in connection with S F Downing esq act as my Executors in carrying out this my last will and testament

In open court personally appeared Robert M Gandy James C Cook & Robert C Pope who being duly sworn and each say that they were present at the residence of Grigsby & Thomas who was at the time very ill and who shortly afterwards to wit on the next day departed this life that while said deponents were in the presence of said Thomas he requested them to take notice that the words which he should then speak were intended for his last will and testament that he then proceeded to make his statements and a memorandum of the words spoken was then & there taken by deponents which was written out in a few days thereafter and all as appears on the other side of this sheet and were spoken on the day stated at the head of said writing Deponents further say that at the time of making said will said G & Thomas was of sound mind & memory

G. E. Thomas' emancipation will continued
 although very feeble in body that so far as dependent on him he did
 it freely of his own accord without any undue influence

Thomas Camak's Will

In the name of God Amen -

I Thomas Camak of the County of Muscogee & State of Georgia being
 of sound and disposing mind and memory and being desirous to set
 the my worldly affairs while I have strength so to do make & publish
 this my last will & testament.

And first I commit my soul to God who gave it and my body
 I desire to be buried by the side of my children in the cemetery in
 Columbus Georgia and my worldly estate I dispose of as follows

First I desire my debts to be paid particularly do I desire that
 my Brother James Camak should be reimbursed for the money he ad-
 vanced to assist me in rebuilding the Alabama Ware House.

Second I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Laura A. Camak
 and her child or children should there be any all property of every
 kind that I may be possessed of to have & hold during the term
 of her natural life Should she die without heirs of my body
 I desire that my property should be divided equally between my
 Mattie Helen I Camak & my brother James Camak of the County of
 Clark - With this exception if there should be any property inherited
 from my Wife's Father Thomas Ragland I leave it altogether at her
 disposal In witness whereof I the said Thomas Camak to this my will
 have set my hand & seal this 28th day of March 1862
