Item 4th In consideration of the many acts of kind-
ness shown me by Mrs. Amanda Sykes wife of J. P. Sykes
of Milledgeville Ga. I hereby will & bequeath to her my Gold
watch together with all my household furniture

5th I give bequeath & devise to Alfred T. Mann,
Mrs. Amanda A. Clark, & Abraham Gindrat in equal
parts all the remainder of my estate real & personal in-
cluding all my Slave Land Stocks negroes debts due me
and of which I may be possessed at the time of my
death and I hereby will & direct that the parts given to
Mrs. Clark & Abraham Gindrat upon their death respectively
go to & become the property of their respective chil-
dren share & share alike

6th I hereby nominate constitute & appoint
Alfred T. Mann Executor of this my last will & testament
