State of Georgia } I Henry Moffett of the State and County
Muscogee County } aforesaid being of sound and disposing
Mind and Memory Throwing the Certainty of
Death and the uncertainty of Life do make constitute and
proclaim this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all
former Wills by me ever made.

Item 1 - I will and direct after my death my Body be
Buried by my family in such a manner as they may see fit and
my immortal Spirit to God who gave it blessing in plenitude on his
Goodness and mercy

Item 2 - I will and direct that all my just debts be paid

Item 3 - I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Norinda
M. Moffet my house and lot in the City of Columbus Georgia

Known as my Residence and the lots in the same place where my Wives
House Stand and appurtenances to be Repaired etc etc belonging

All my Stove hood and Kitchen furniture of every description -
Library &c save my Rose Wood Piano worth the sum of one thousand

Dollars in Money - a Railroad and Horse two hundred Dollars
of Corn one thousand pounds of Tobacco two Crows a Calves one Cow

and Pig the Stays and Coats to be selected by my wife out of any
I may have or had at my death for her sole and exclusive

use benefit and Support for and during her natural life from
from the debts - Contracts - liabilities or control of any future

Husband she may ever have she is also authorized to sell
a post either at Rubin butchery or Private either or one of the

lots aforesaid to provide the proceeds of the sale to Remunerate in
other property with place Stone in law of the original Subject

to all the restrictions and final disposition herein before of the
Grigrace property - and Should my wife never marry she is

authorized to dispose of all the property left for her use and
benefit by will only with said Will shall have full effect

until after her death and in the event of her marriage again
after her death all of said property is to be Equally divided

in the City of Columbus Georgia being described in a Deed made to me

by George P. Snider & Prester for dues Mangatt. P. Birch Water Octobre
the first - 1866 - eighteen hundred and sixty six and after her death to be

any one surviving her and in the event she dies leaving no child
or children it is to be Equally Divided Between my surviving

Children or the heirs of their Wives and in the event my
Daughter Mrs Emma L. Moyer dies to have said place sold or exchanged

Item 4th for other property obtained after her original be it so in the event the proceeds of the sale of the other property obtained obtained in lieu of the original shall stand strictly in lieu of the original in every particular in regard to liberate contract and final distribution and that it furthermore meets with the approbation of Nancy P. Moffett whom I hereby nominate and appoint as her Trustee in the Management and Control of all property or interest she may be entitled to in any way or time under this my Will.

Item 5. I give and bequeath to my Son Henry P. Moffett all the land of South half Section twenty five Town ship Eighteen Range Twenty eight laying on the East side of the Little Fisher Creek all the portion of Section thirty six Town ship Eighteen Range Twenty Eight was sold by me to J. G. Clayton supposed to be about five thousand acres west half of Section thirty one Town ship Eighteen Range Twenty nine North half of Section Six Town ship Seventeen Range Nine South most part of west west forth Section five from this Section Range Twenty nine except the portion sold by W. D. Bishop to Mrs. A. Williamson South East fourth Section Thirty five Town ship Eighteen Range Twenty Eight the portion of the above Specified and described land in this the Fifth Item of my will laying and being north of what is known as the Road Crossing the Creek at Bishop's Bridge I give to my said Son Henry P. Moffett and Reserved to my Estate the portion of said Land with his Street of said Road all situated in originally Russell County State of Alabama

Item 6th I have to my Daughter Sarah Ella Moffett during her natural life to the sole and exclusive use benefit and support of her self and her children - my plantation laying in Section Seven town ship Seventeen Range Twenty nine South Half of Section Eight Town ship of Section Range Twenty nine with all the Buildings and appurtenances thereunto belonging together with my Rose wood Piano Works all of said lands situated in originally Russell County Alabama free from the debts liberators Contract or Control of any kind she may ever have and should she die leaving Child or children then said property is to go to them But should she die without any surviving child or children the said property is to be Equally divided between my surviving children or the heirs of their Bodys And should my Daughter Sarah Ella Moffett desire to sell a part or all the lands let a part for her uses and benefit or need it be it so - provided the property obtained for that disposed of - stand as the original Relative to titles Contract liberators and in further meets with the approbation of Henry P. Moffett whom I hereby appoint her Trustee in the Management of all the property that she may ever be interested in under this Will.

Item 7. I will and direct that all other property thing or things Real personal or mixed not herein before disposed of be sold and I authorize my Executor and Executrix to sell off my Lands in the State of Texas either privately or at publick auctioning to exercise their best discretion in the premises as to make and reasonable time to dispose of the same so as to act to the best interest of my Estate the proceed of

Item 8^o - owing to the Recusant emancipation of all my slaves and
 the Burning and Destroying of my Property in the late War I have now means
 now to make my wife and two younger children Equal to what I now
 together with I have formerly given my older children viz Mrs Tolson my
 step brother and Charles D. Woffett

Item 9 I nominate and appoint my beloved wife as Executrix and my son
 Henry Woffett and Doctor in law Pleasant O. Phillips my Executrix to carry this 18
 my last will and Testimony in to effect and direct that neither of them be
 required to give security this the 26th October 1867

Item 11. Upon Recollection it is my desire and will that the sum of
 \$10000 be used in my plantation this year or the year of my death shall now be sold
 by my Executrix and Executrix for general distribution among all my legatees
 but shall be equally divided between my wife and my daughter Sarah
 Ella Woffett this Oct 26th 1867 Regd Henry Woffett

 Gold watch the same that I now have but the Chain and Case

Kyle sign the same as Subscribing witness at the like Request of Said Henry Moffet and also in his presence and in the presence of each other both to the will and Codicel attached and deponent further says that Said Henry Moffet was at the time of executing Said will and Codicel of sound mind and disposing mind and memory and that so far as deponents know or believe he did it freely with out any undue influence or compulsion.
