

Kipolite Gladwester's Will

Muscogee County, Georgia Wills, Book C, 1875-1891

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State of Georgia Muscogee County

In the name of God, Amen.

I Kipolite Gladwester of the City of Columbus, County and State aforesaid, being ill of body, but of sound mind and disposing memory, and desirous of settling all my worldly affairs, while I have strength and capacity to do so, do make declare and publish, this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all wills by me at any time hereinafore made.

Item 1st I will and direct that all my just debts shall be paid (my only indebtedness being for Doctors bills, Medicine and expenses of last illness.)

Item 2^d I will and direct that my burial and funeral be conducted inexpensively, without ostentation or display, as becomes the last rites of a Soldier.

Item 3^e I will and direct that my Executor Dr. F. A. Stanford as herein after named do pay unto George G. Golden of the City of Columbus, Ga. the sum of Five Hundred dollars \$500⁰⁰ in trust to and for the following uses and benefits. That the said Golden, Trustee shall use, appropriate and disburse the said sum of \$500⁰⁰ in such manner and amounts as he may deem proper, for the benefit, board and maintenance of Louis J. Geisinger a minor, who has been with me and in my employ for several years past, provided that the said Louis J. Geisinger shall and does enter the "Volunteers Home Works" of the City of Columbus, or such similar institution as said Golden may select, and diligently apply himself to the acquirement of a trade therein, and so long as his deportment, habits and conduct, shall meet the requirements and approval of said Golden, and should the said Geisinger at any time, in his habits, conduct and deportment, fail to comply with the command, and give satisfaction to said Golden, then I will and direct, that the said George G. Golden, determining such fact in his own discretion, shall and do at such time as he may choose and direct pay over any and all residue and remainder of said sum of \$500⁰⁰ which may then be in his hands unexpended unto the Trustees and Directors of the Columbia Female Orphan Asylum of the City of Columbus Ga., for the use and benefit of the Orphans therein, and in full discharge of this trust.

Item 4^t I give and bequeath to William Saw my servant and Nurse for his faithful attention the sum of One hundred dollars.

Item 5^t I give and bequeath to Josephus Mauntis Twenty five dollars, to Eliza Carson & Lizzie Harper the sum of Twenty Dollars, each.

Item 6^t I will and direct that my Trunk, Clothing and such other articles of personal property, as I may now, be disposed of by my Executor, as he may deem fit.

Item 7^t I will and direct that after paying all the Funeral Expenses, Legacies, and Bequests, hereinbefore enumerated, and after paying all my debts, and his own bill for medical services to me rendered by him Dr. F. A. Stanford of Columbus Ga. that he the said Dr. Stanford do pay over all and singular the remainder and residue of my Estate, consisting principally of Money now on deposit at my Credit in the Chattahoochee National Bank of Columbus, in the following manner, and to the following uses and benefits. The sum of Fifteen hundred dollars to be paid by him for the purchase money of the Residence now occupied by Louis Geisinger a minor now living with his Mother in the City of Mobile and State of Alabama, said residence being on Charleston street, between Franklin & Wilkinson streets of said City. Or in lieu of that particular property, in

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other suitable real estate, for a home in said City. And the said Stamford my Executor to have the real estate purchased by him as herein above directed, conveyed direct by the vendor, with Warranty Deed unto said Louise Geisinger in absolute and full simple title forever. And such sums as may be left in the hands of my Executor after purchasing said real estate for Louise Geisinger, and paying all expenses incidental to the execution of this my last will and testament I hereby will and direct shall be paid to the legally qualified guardians of said Louise Geisinger, upon their receiving for the same. And I do will and direct, that the said Guardians shall invest the principal of such sum as they shall receive for the said Louise Geisinger in United States Bonds paying out and using the interest thereof for her maintenance, Education and benefit during her minority, and delivering the said Bonds unto her when she shall attain legal age. And I do hereby give and bequeath the said real estate and money under the conditions aforesaid, unto the said Louise Geisinger, for and as her sole, absolute and separate estate, to be forever free from the liabilities, debts, contracts or control of her husband should she ever marry.

Item 8th I hereby appoint G. F. A. Stanford of the City of Columbus, the sole Executor of this my last will and testament.

Court of Ordinary at Chambers September 12th 1878

Befor me F. W. Brooks Ordinary in and for said County personally came on the 12th day of September 1878 at Chambers for the purpose
