It is my will and I desire & direct, that all my just debts be paid without delay, by my Executors, herein after named & appointed.

I give, bequeath and devise unto my beloved wife Sarah Willett all my property of every description, real and personal, of which I may be possessed to her own proper use and behoof, for and during her natural life, and at her death to be equally divided between my four children Eola M. Willett, William Raleigh Willett, Lela Ann Willett and Neal Stanford Willett, share & share alike

It is my will and desire, and I hereby direct that the business in which I am now engaged shall be continued after my death by my son William Raleigh Willett, as it now is, subject to the direction of

Item 4th

It is my will and desire, that my said four children, Esda M. Willott, William Raleigh Willott, Ida Ann Willott, and Neal Stanford Willott, shall all continue to reside with their Mother Sarah Willott, at her present residence until they become of age, or marry, and that my said wife Sarah Willott shall give to them such support, maintenance and education as may be consistent with her means and my station in life, and that my said children shall assist their Mother in every practicable way, while they may continue to reside with her.

Item 5th

I hereby nominate and appoint my beloved wife Sarah Willott sole Executrix of this my last will and testament, and I do not desire that she should be required to give any bond or to make any Inventory or Returns to any Court or Courts whatsoever, and I therefore hereby release her from doing any of these things.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the Fourth day of November in the year of our Lord one Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighty

Mrs. Sarah Banks' Will

State of Georgia Muscogee County

In the name of God, Amen,

I Sarah Banks, of said County and State, being of advanced age, but of sound and disposing mind and memory; knowing the uncertainty of life, and the certainty of death, deem it right and proper, both as respects my family and myself, that I should make a disposition of the property, with which a kind Providence has blessed me, I do therefore make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and annulling all others by me heretofore made,

First I direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner, suitable to my circumstances and condition in life. My soul I trust shall return to rest, with God, who gave it

Second I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without unnecessary delay by my Executor, herein after named and appointed

Third I desire and direct, that one or two thousand dollars be set apart out of my Estate and by my Executor spent for the purchase and erection of a monument over my husband John Banks, and over the graves of my four sons, Broun, Willie, Matt and Eugene

Fourth I will and bequeath, that all my property, of every description real & personal be equally divided between my eight children, George I. Banks, E. Sims Banks, Gilmer H. Banks, Susan M. Banks, Albert A. Banks, W. H. Banks, Lucy Young and Josephine Peacock, with the exception of certain personal property which I have already given them, and is now virtually in possession of those to whom given
