In all whom it may concern be it known by these presents that
 I James E. Butt being in the full possession of my mind and deeply
 sensible of the danger to which I am subjected by my relations with
 the army of the Confederate States of America do this day make my
 will as to how my effects may be distributed after my death

Paragraph 1st To my niece Jeannett the daughter of my brother
 Dr R. L. Butt I do bequeath & bestow the following named negroes
 to wit Aaron, Malinda, Clara, Dallas, Samuel, Thomas, Lizzie,
 Jesse and Aaron — but in case that the said Jeannett shall die be-
 fore coming of age the above enumerated negroes I bequeath &
 bestow upon my niece Elizabeth the daughter of my brother
 Dr R. L. Butt And further in case the said Elizabeth should die
 before arriving at her majority I do bequeath & bestow said ne-
 groes enumerated in this paragraph to my nephew Richard
 Samuel the son of Dr R. L. Butt

Paragraph 2^d I do further bequeath & bestow upon An-
 na Hunter the daughter of my sister S. A. King the following named
 negroes to wit viz. Cloc, Victor, Lamb, Jenny, Amy, Jefferson
 Lavinia And in case the said Anna Hunter should die before at-
 taining her majority I do bequeath & bestow the negroes enum-
 erated in this second paragraph to my niece Lallie Dancy the
 youngest daughter of my sister Sarah A. King

Paragraph 3^d I do bequeath & bestow on my niece Min-
 cilla Bird the daughter of my sister Virginia & of Samuel Bird
 the following named negroes to wit Wesley & Jim Russell

Paragraph 3^d I do bestow & bequeath to my brother William
 all land plantation stock and so much of two notes held against
 John H. Butt as may remain after the payment of any liabilities
 against my estate Also Nancy, Dora, Lavinia, Sam Ann, George
 Ann, Bob Also Sam Banks Wm. Smith

Margaret Bozeman's Will

State of Georgia } I am the name of God Amen!

Muscogee County } I Margaret Bozeman of the County and State aforesaid and widow of James Bozeman late of the County of Baldwin in said State deceased being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make ordain publish and declare this as my last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all others by me heretofore made.

Item 1st It is my will and desire that any executor hereinafter named shall pay all of any just debts out of any monies sales dues or other property he may receive as such executor under the ordinary clause of this my will.

Item 2^d I give and bequeath to my son James F. Bozeman the following named negro property to wit: Mary a female born about fifty years her son Charles aged about twenty eight years and her two grand children Lewis and Mary two girls aged about eight years to have and to hold them the aforesaid negroes with the natural increase of the females if there should be any to him the said James F. Bozeman his heirs and assigns forever.

Item 3^d I give and bequeath to my said son James F. Bozeman his heirs and assigns forever the following named negro property to wit: Charles a negro man aged about twenty two years Elizabeth a negro girl aged about twelve years and Virginia a negro female child aged about four years together with the natural increase of the females should there be any to him the said James F. Bozeman his heirs and assigns forever.
