

James H. Bogerman Will
Muscogee County, Georgia Wills, Book C, 1875-1891
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In the name of God, Amen.

I, James H. Bogerman of the County of Muscogee and State of Georgia being of sound and disposing mind and memory, and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs, while I have strength so to do, do make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all wills by me at any time heretofore made.

First I Commit my soul to God, who gave it, and my body to be buried in the family burial ground at Providence Church, and my worldly estate I dispose of as follows.

First My real estate consisting of fifty six acres of land more or less, being and lying in the Corveta Reserve, No 146, and then acres of the south east corner of fraction No 147, Corveta Reserve, and four acres of the North west corner of lot No 16 in the 9th land district making in all sixty three acres more or less, And also all my live stock, that I may have at my death I do now give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah Ann Elizabeth after my death, that she may have a support from the proceeds of the above estate, and that both our burial expenses be defrayed out of the above named estate, and after the death of my said wife Sarah Ann Elizabeth, then all the expenses to be paid out of said estate, then the remainder to go to John H. Brithain as his own property, for which he is to take all the necessary care of the said James H. Bogerman and Sarah Ann Elizabeth, my wife. Now the said John H. Brithain is to take charge of said estate, and act as Executor of said estate, and manage it to the best advantage he can, or he is to act as my agent and transact my business for me, during my natural life, and also for my wife Sarah Ann Elizabeth, during her natural life.

In witness whereof, I the said James H. Bogerman to this my will, consisting of the foregoing or shut of paper, have set my hand and seal this the 20th day of August 1880

In the name of God, Amen!

I, Joseph Denson being of sound mind, and
disposing memory, desire while I am in health, and can calmly
consider as to the disposition of my worldly Estate; to so dispose
thereof, as shall vest in my daughter Mary, wife of James Boy-
Slade full title and possession of any and every kind of prop-
erty of which I may die possessed, whether it be lands, or house-
hold furniture, or notes and accounts (having already pro-
vided for my Son William to a larger extent than I find my-
self now able to bequeath my daughter Mary), save and except
that I herein and hereby relinquish all claim I have on my Son
William for monies advanced him at divers times, all else I
desire my Daughter Mary to be possessed of.

For the purpose of carrying this will into effect I appoint
my trusted Son in law James Boy Slade my Executor without
requiring him to give Bond and Security. Witness my hand and
seal this 1st day of July 1878.
