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State of Georgia } I, James M. Chambers of the County
Muscogee County } and State aforesaid being of Sound
Mind and memory Recalling Any and every Will which I may here before
Made do make and declare this to be my last Will and
Testament

1. Having Advanced to such of any one of my Children the
patrimony which I designed giving them when they arrived at
the age of twenty one Years - I desire that all my Estate Real
and Personal shall at my death be divided Equally Among them
Share and Share a like

2. If at my death any one of my Children shall be dead
leaving a child or children then and in that Event it
is my Will that such Child or children of my deceased
Child shall stand in the place of his or her or theirs -
deceased father or Mother and shall Receive the Share of
my Estate which his or her or theirs deceased father or Mother
would have Received had he or she been living, but if such
Child or children shall die without issue, before -
Arriving at the age of twenty one Years then and in that -
Event the portion of my Estate with such Child or children
may have Received shall Revert to and become a part of my
Estate and shall be distributed in accordance with the
provisions of this paragraph

3. my Children being all of full Age it is my desire
that they shall themselves make an appropriation and
apportionment of my Estate Among them Below in accordance
with the plan of Distribution hereinbefore set forth
without the intervention of appraisers and appportionators
appointed by the Court and my Executor herein after named
is here by fully authorized and Empowered with out
asking or obtaining Any Order of Court there for to -
make all sale that may be necessary for the purpose
of effecting the distribution aforesaid - it being my Will
and desire that my Estate shall be fairly and Equally
divided Among my Children with as little legal
cerimony as possible

4. I appoint my son William H. Chambers Executor
of this my Will
