I John A. Huff of the County of Muscogee and State of Georgia being of sound and disposing mind and memory, but being infirm of body and health. Knowing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death, do make, ordain, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament

Item 1st

It is my will, that my beloved wife Nancy H. Huff shall at my death, have and possess in her own right, free from any conditions or limitations, all the property I now own and possess, real, personal and mixed. I do this, knowing, that she will be just as regards our children, and that she will pay any debts, which she can pay that have been contracted by me, and in the payment of which, she and our children, will not be deprived of the reasonable living and comforts to which they are entitled, and which are guaranteed them by the laws of the land. Deponent further says that at the time of publishing and declaring said will, said testator was of sound and disposing mind and memory, and so far as witness knows or believes, he did it fully and voluntarily and without any undue influence or compulsion.
