John Fontaine's Will
The State of Georgia Muscogee County

I John Fontaine being now blessed with ordinary good
health and of a sound and disposing mind and memory but being
admonished by my advanced age that I must soon in accordance
with the law of nature go hence and no more have a place of ex-
istence on this earth and having heretofore made and published
my will disposing of the property and effects with which God has
blessed me and which I had hoped to leave as a Legacy to my
children and grand children but much of which property has been
lost and destroyed by the misfortunes and exigencies of the
times through which the Country and its people have passed with-
in the last five years do hereby make publick and declare the
following as my last will and testament hereby revoking and
making null and void all wills and testaments which have hereto-
fore been made by me

Item 1 It is my will and I hereby direct that my Executors hereinafter
named shall pay off and discharge all my just debts if there should
be any against me at the time of my death

Item 2 And whereas I have heretofore given to my daughter now
deceased the former wife of James T. Filewellen Esq a plantation
of considerable value I do now hereby give and bequeath to
my grand daughter Nellie Filewellen the sum of Ten
thousand dollars to be paid to her in cash by my Execu-
tors when she shall arrive at legal age or upon her
marriage if before her legal maturity to have and to hold
to her and her heirs forever

Item 3 I hereby give and bequeath to my grandson Charles
W. Stanford the sum of Ten thousand dollars to be paid
to him in cash by my Executors when he shall arrive at legal
age And it is my will and I hereby direct that my said Exec-
utors shall pay annually to Dr C. A. Stanford or in case of his
death to the Guardian of my said Grandson Charles Stanford
during his minority the sum of One thousand and fifty (\$1050)

dollars, said sum being the interest accruing and accumulating on the demand I hold against Mr. Alfred for my in the Columbus Factory recently sold to him upon time to be applied and used for the support maintenance and education of my said grandson and upon his legal maturity my said executors shall pay to him the said sum of fifteen thousand dollars for which said note was given to have and to hold to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item 4 I hereby give bequeath and devise to my sons Benjamin Fontaine & Theophilus Fontaine Francis Fontaine and George Fontaine all of the remainder and residue of my estate both real and personal of every kind whatever to be equally divided by them after the legal maturity of all of them or if it should be necessary or desirable to divide said estate before all of said children should arrive at legal age then it shall be divided as the law may direct and prescribe to have and to hold to them their heirs and assigns forever.

Item 5 I hereby constitute and appoint my said sons Benjamin Fontaine Theophilus Fontaine Francis Fontaine and George Fontaine as Executors of this my last will and testament with full power and authority to carry out and execute the provisions of the same in any jurisdiction or State without giving bond and security as executors aforesaid.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal on this the 8th day of March 1866.

On this 15th day of November 1866 in vacation comes Alfred Iverson & Wiley Williams who being sworn on oath say that they were present when John Fontaine then in life but now deceased executed the foregoing instrument in writing that at the time of executing it he published and declared it to be his last will and testament & that he signed the same in the presence of deponents and B Beasley who at his request signed their names as witnesses thereto in presence of said Fontaine & of each other And deponents further say that afterwards court on the day of the date thereof said Fontaine executed in like manner his Codicil to said will published declared and signed as aforesaid in presence of deponents and Harvey Hall who subscribed their names (at the request of said Fontaine) thereto as witnesses in his presence and in presence of each other

Deponents further say that at the time of executing said written instruments said Fontaine was of sound and disposing mind and memory and that so far as witnesses know or believe he did it freely of his own accord without any undue influence or compulsion
