I John Mc Govern of said State and County being of advanced age but of sound & disposing mind and memory knowing that I must shortly depart this life deem it right & proper both as it respects my family & myself that I should make a right disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me with I do therefore make this my last will and testament hereby revoking & annulling all others made by me

1st I desire & direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances in life My soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it as I hope for salvation through the merits and atonement of the Blessed Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ

2^d I desire & direct that all my just ~~debts~~ be paid without delay by my Executors hereinafter mentioned & appointed

3^d I give & bequeath & devise to my beloved wife Bridget Mc Govern my present residence fronting on Jackson Street and lot with the exception of a part heretofore given by me to my mother which is about forty feet more or less on the back part of said lot fronting on Chapel St.

4th I will & bequeath to my beloved wife a house & lot on Grant St in the city of Columbus being a part of lot number (86) meaning the income arising from the same during her natural life Also the income of one half of the house & lot number two hundred & fifty (250) situated on Ogletown St that being my interest in the same during her natural life

5th I will & bequeath to my sister Ann two hundred & fifty

dollars from the proceeds of my personal property also to my
 sister Sarah one hundred & fifty dollars to be paid to my brother
 Patrick all of my set of tinner's tools

6th

All other property that I am possessed of to be given
 to my wife. It is understood that so much of the within writing
 will as relates to number eighty six and two hundred & fifty in the
 event of the death of my beloved wife shall be divided as fol-
 lows to wit the house & lot situated on Grant St. shall be equal-
 ly divided between my three brothers and my interest in the house
 on Ogletown St. between my two sisters Ann & Sarah.

 Brasill & Michael McCahy Executors of this my last will &
 testament this 31st day of February 1866
