

Lamoy. E. Allen Will

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State of Georgia Muscogee County

I, Lamoy. E. Allen of said County and State of sound mind and disposing memory being convinced of the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death, do hereby make declare and publish this as my last will and testament

Item 1st I give and bequeath all my household and kitchen furniture and whatever other personal property that I may have to my two Sons James B. Allen and Edward Allen to be divided equally between them share and share alike

Item 2nd I give bequeath and devise to my two well beloved Sons James B. Allen and Edward Allen my interest in House and lot number three hundred and Eighty (380) in the City of Columbus which interest is the interest set apart to me as a twelve months support by the Ordinary of Said County out of the said House and lot - the same to be divided equally and share and share alike between my two Sons aforesaid

Item 3rd I also give bequeath and devise the remaining interest being the one third undivided interest in and to City lots with all the improvements thereon and known as Number three hundred and Eighty (380) and Five hundred and Eleven (511) on Forsyth Street in the City of Columbus, belonging to me, to my two Sons to be divided between them equally share and share alike

Item 4th I desire and direct that the interests to the real property here in given and devised to my said Sons shall not be sold and divided between them until my younger Son Edward Allen shall arrive at the age of Twenty One years, unless a suitable opportunity should occur for them to engage in business, (to be judged of by my elder Son James B. Allen,) then and in that case he is authorized to sell any part or the whole of said property for their mutual benefit and advantage.

Item 5th I hereby appoint my Son James B. Allen my Executor of this my last will and testament, and I desire & direct that he shall not be required to give any bond or to make any annual returns as Executor as aforesaid, but to keep an account of all his doings & doings in the premises.

Item 6th I also desire and direct that my said Son James B. Allen act as Testamentary Guardian of any Son

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Edward Allen, if any be necessary until the said Edward arrives of age, but that as such Guardian he be not required to give bond or make returns to the Ordinary of the County.

I George White Senior of said State & County make this my last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all others heretofore made by me.

Item 1st I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay, by my Executor and Executors hereinafter named, as I am unwilling my creditors should be delayed of their rights especially as there is no necessity for delay

Item 2nd I give and devise to my beloved wife Malinda lot of Land number Two hundred and four (204) Containing one hundred and forty acres. Part of lot number 189 Containing Eighty two acres (82) Lot of land number one hundred and ninety (190) Containing two hundred two and half acres more or less (202 1/2) Part of lot number one hundred and eighty nine (189) Containing Seventy Six acres (76) With all the rights numbers and appertinances to said Lots of land, containing five hundred (500) acres in any wise appertaining or belonging free from all charge or limitation whatever to her own proper use, benefit during her natural life I also give and bequeath to my wife in the same unreserved manner, the farming utensils used on and belonging to said plantation of every description, whatever, and four mules and three cows and calves and nine head of Hogs, and one Yoke of oxen and three yearlings, All my household and kitchen furniture belonging to said plantation, Two Buggys all without reserve or limitation.

Item 3rd I constitute and appoint my beloved wife Malinda White Executrix and my Son Abner W. White Executor to this my last will and testament this May 25th 1876
