I Lavinia A Fox being weak
 and feeble in body but of sound mind and memory do make
 this my last will & testament

- 1st I will & bequeath unto my niece Susan S Sale (wife of Miles S Sale)
 the following negro slaves to wit Caroline a woman aged about thirty
 years, Sadiska a woman aged about twenty two years &
 her child Flora aged about seven together with their household
 furniture for and during her natural life to her sep-
 arate use not subject to debts or contracts of her present or
 any future husband
- 2nd At the death of the said Susan Sale I will & bequeath the
 aforesaid property to the daughter of the said Susan S Sale Elvise
 Sale
- 3rd Should the said Elvise Sale happen to depart this life before her
 mother Susan S Sale then & in that event I will all of the afore-
 said property at the death of said Susan to my sister Sarah Moore
 and her children equally to be divided among them
- 4th In as much as my husband Richard A Fox is old & infirm
 and as I have given to the said Susan Sale all of my sep-
 arate estate for & during her natural life my request & desire is
 that he shall have the privilege of living with my said wife
 during his natural life and as far as may be convenient to
 share in the labor & benefits of the said slaves
- 5th I hereby constitute & appoint
 my will And having disposed of my earthly effects I desire my
 body to be buried according to the customs of Christian people
 and commending my soul to the keeping of a just Providence
 I am prepared to die in peace with all the living

Thomas Sloan's Will

I Thomas Sloan of the County of Muscogee State of Georgia do make certain declare & publish this my last will & testament

- Item 1st I wish that all my debts be paid as soon as they conveniently can be
- Item 2^d I give & bequeath all my property of whatever kind or nature to my father Adam C Sloan
- Item 3^d I appoint my father & my friend Judge M J Wellborn of Columbus Georgia my executors & empower them or either of them to wind up my estate in any way they think best I give them full power to sell, barter, exchange or transfer any of my property & to compound any of my claims And if Judge Wellborn should be unwilling to qualify I request that he give my father all the assistance & information he can which will enable him to wind up my estate properly
