I Louis Haiman being now of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament

Item 1st Having heretofore by two certain Deeds conveyed a large portion of my property lying both in Georgia and Alabama to Nathan Crown and Trust for the use and benefit of my wife and children, and the said Nathan Crown having sold certain portions of said property and used the proceeds of said sales by the consent of my said wife in paying of certain debts to which the said property might have been subjected but are doing of which the said Trustee may have not followed the terms of said Deeds and so may have incurred a liability to the extent of such property so sold by him and being desirous that the said Crown should be relieved from any such liability and that the amount secured to my wife and children under said Deeds should not be diminished - I will and direct my Executor out of my Estate after paying all my debts to pay over to the said Nathan Crown as Trustee under said Deeds or to his successor in Trust an amount equal to the proceeds of all the property which may have been so sold by him and for which said Trustee might have become liable to be invested by such Trustee in such property as my wife may select or approve and be held by him under said deed and in lieu of the property so sold by him or if my wife shall select any portion of the property now owned by me of equal value to such property so sold by said Trustee then I give such property so selected by my said wife to the said Trustee to be held under said deed in lieu of the property so sold by him

Item 2nd I give and bequeath all the balance of my property to my wife as her sole and separate estate forever

Item 3rd I constitute my brother Elias Haiman Executor of this my last will and Testament
