State of Georgia & I, Lucinda Andrews of said County, do make  
Muscogee County & publish and declare, the following as my true last  
will and testament, hereby revoking any other will heretofore made  
by me.

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I desire all my just debts to be paid by my Executor, herein after  
named.

Item 2<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath unto Martha Andrews my daughter, and  
Ella Andrews, daughter of Ella Andrews, deceased, said Ella Andrews  
being my grand daughter, all of my estate of every description  
equally to be divided between them, share and share alike.

Item 3<sup>d</sup> I constitute and appoint Richard F. Young sole Executor of  
this will. June 24<sup>th</sup> 1875.

I Susan H. Philips, being of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking any wills, by me heretofore made.

Item 1<sup>st</sup> It is my will, that all my just debts be paid,

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I give unto my son Frank Philips the sum of one dollar and desire my Executor to pay it to him as soon as possible.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> After the payment of all my just debts, and the payment to Frank Philips my son of one dollar, I give, devise and bequeath unto my two sons Charles and Ethelinda Philips, to be divided equally between them two, all the remainder of my property of whatever kind, real or personal, all stocks, money, all notes given by any person or persons whatsoever.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I appoint my son Charles Philips as Executor of this my will. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this 18<sup>th</sup> day of April A. D. 1874.
