

# Will of Mrs Martha D. Flournoy

State of Georgia Muscogee County, Georgia Wills, Book C, 1875-1891  
In the name of God Amen

I Martha D. Flournoy of said State and County, being of sound and disposing mind and memory - knowing that it is appointed to all persons to die, and feeling the importance and propriety of making disposition of my property now that I am in condition to do so, do hereby make & declare this to be my last will and testament

Item First I request that all my just debts be paid by my Executor as soon as it can be conveniently done.

Item Second It is my will and I so direct that my grand daughter Evelyn a Jones, wife of J. J. Jones shall receive one half of my estate for the reason that her mother my daughter Mary did not share equally in the division of her father Josiah Flournoys Estate

Item Third It is my will and I desire that the remaining half of my Estate be divided equally amongst my surviving children & my grand daughter Francis Flournoy daughter of my son Thomas Flournoy for the reason that my grand daughter Francis Flournoy is an married and in a dependent situation compared with the rest of her brothers and sisters

Item Fourth I hereby give to my Executors the power to see all or any portion of my property upon such terms as they may deem advisable in order to make the division and pay the bequest herein before specified.

Item Fifth I hereby constitute and appoint Robert Flournoy and J. J. Jones as Executors of my last will and testament
