Patsy Morris' Will (colored woman)

State of Georgia Muscogee County - In the name of God Amen
I Patsy Morris of said State & County being of advanced age and knowing that I must shortly depart this life deem it right & proper that I should make a disposition of the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me do therefore make this my last will & testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me

1st Item I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances & condition in life My soul shall return to rest I trust with that God who gave it

2nd Item I desire & direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors hereinafter appointed as I am unwilling my creditors should be delayed in their rights especially as there is no necessity for delay

3rd Item I give bequeath & devise the house in which I am now living it being a one story house with two rooms in the city of Columbus & State of Georgia located on lot number 469 with twenty one feet front on Baldwin Street commencing where a line drawn from the North East corner of the before named house to Baldwin Street thence West twenty one feet thence South fifty six feet thence East twenty one feet thence North fifty six feet to Baldwin Street to the corner from which the line was first started to Randolph M Mulford son of Davis Mulford with all the rights & appurtenances to said above described house & lot in any wise belonging free from all charge & limitation whatever to his own use & benefit & behoof with the request that his father Davis (Mulford) receive the rents profits & income arising from said house & lot & in part it for the good of his said son Randolph M Mulford and act as his Guardian as well as his father in the premises with the request further that the said Davis Mulford control the above named house & lot for his son Randolph M Mulford until in the said Randolph M Mulford becomes of age or attains his majority

4th Item I give bequeath & devise the remainder of the lot on which I am now living it being lot number 469 in the city of Columbus said lot having on it two single story wooden houses it being a part of the above described lot situated on Baldwin Street to Sarah Martha Mauley oldest daughter of Joseph Morris & his wife Celine (he being the oldest child)
