

# Mary A. Lowe's Will.

Muscogee County, Georgia Wills, Book C, 1875-1891  
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Georgia Harris County

I, Mary A. Lowe, formerly of said County but now of Muscogee County said State, of sound mind and disposing memory do hereby make this my last Will and testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me.

Item 1<sup>st</sup> - I give and bequeath to my son Andrew J. Lowe, One Hundred dollars to be paid him out of my Estate, and no more, because he has received already a large portion of his Father's Estate and is in better condition than my other children.

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> - I give and bequeath to my daughter Maria E. Vance, One Blanket, one quilt, one comfort, one pair of sheets, and one pair of pillow cases.

Item 3<sup>d</sup> - I give and bequeath to my Grand son Jimmie Lowe son of B. H. Lowe to be paid out of my Estate, Two Hundred dollars

Item 4<sup>th</sup> - I desire and direct after the special bequests made in Items 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>d</sup>, that the remainder of my Estate be divided into three equal parts or valuation, and one part I give to my Grand children Mollie and Jimmie Lowe children of Ben H. Lowe and I hereby appoint the said Ben H. Lowe Testamentary Guardian for the said Mollie and Jimmie to receive and manage the part herein given, as also for the bequest in Item 3<sup>d</sup>. One part to my daughter Maria E. Vance and in case of her death or marriage, to her son Samuel Vance, the third part to my daughter Mary Lowe Crawford.

Item 5<sup>th</sup> - I hold notes and obligations from my children but these I have cancelled by receipt on the same, my desire and intention being to consider the past as settled and from this the future disposition as herein provided.

Item 6<sup>th</sup> - I desire and appoint my son B. H. Lowe and Bennett H. Crawford Executors hereof.

## William E. Parramore's Will.

State of Georgia Muscogee County.

In the name of God Amen!

I, William E. Parramore of the City of Columbus Muscogee County Georgia being of sound and disposing mind and memory and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs while I have strength so to do, do make, publish and declare this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all wills by me heretofore made.

First Item: I commit my soul to God who gave it; and I direct that my body be buried in a Christian like manner, suitable to my circumstances and condition in life. And my worldly Estate I dispose of as follows:

For the natural love and affection that I have alike for each of my six children, whose names and ages are as follows: Laura Jane Parramore born November 9, 1845. John Robert Parramore born Feby 24, 1848. Mary Francis wife of Clements born Feby 8, 1850, James Augustus Parramore born Decr 27, 1851, Emma Rebecca, wife of John Lehman born March 15, 1854, and Sophronia Elizabeth wife of George Yonbrough born July 12, 1857. I will and bequeath to each, one sixth of my whole Estate, share and share alike, without regard to any amounts I may have at any time heretofore paid to or advanced to any of them, it being my will and desire to divide equally between all of them the Estate I may own at the time of my death.

Second Item: It is my will and desire that my Executors hereinafter named shall so soon as practicable after my death sell all my property both real and personal (except my stock in the Eagle & Phoenix Manufacturing Company) which stock is hereinafter disposed of in another Item of this my last will. And after selling my property real and personal, which I direct be done without any order of Court.
