Mary Clark's Will

I Mary Clark of the City of Columbus Muscogee County and State of Georgia being in feeble bodily health but of sound and disposing mind and memory calling to mind the frailty and uncertainty of human life and being desirous of settling my worldly affairs and directing how my estate which it has pleased God to have blessed me shall be disposed of after my decease while I have strength & capacity so as to make this my last will and testament hereby revoking & making null and void all other wills & testaments by me heretofore made And first I commend my immortal being to him who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried as becomes my station in life by my executor herein after named

And as to my worldly estate and all property not personal or mixed of which I shall die seized & possessed or to which I shall be entitled at the time of my decease I devise bequeath and dispose thereof in the manner following to wit
 The primer my will is that all my just debts & funeral expenses shall by my executor herein after named be paid out of my estate as soon after my decease as shall by him be found convenient

Item I give devise & bequeath to my dear daughter Mary Clark all that lot & parcel of land being & situate in the

last taught from Clayton Also my negro woman Mary about forty years
of age & dark complexion Also one Bureau one Wardrobe two Feather
beds & all my hot clothes Also one speckled no horned cow & one calf

Now I also give devise & bequeath to my eldest son Martin
Clark one Feather bed and Mattress & Bedstead & all other furniture I have
not otherwise bequeathed or disposed of

Also I also give devise & bequeath to my youngest son Peter
Clark that lot & parcel of land lying & being in the city of Columbus
County of Muscogee & State of Georgia and fronting on the narrow
street running directly to the Bridge commencing four feet from
Walton's house on the east and running along said narrow
street to within four feet of the lot sold John Walton on the
West and embracing a front on said narrow street of some
twenty three feet three inches thence running up said street about
directly two feet ten inches thence east to said John Walton's lot
and thence south to the place of beginning Also one Feather Bed
Mattress & bedstead also one red cow

Lastly I do nominate my son Martin Clark to be my
executor and Guardian for my daughter Mary Clark & my
son Peter Clark In testimony whereof I the said Mary Clark
have to this my last will & testament contained and then
three sheets of paper subscribed my name & affixed my seal this
the fourteenth (14) day of January in the year of our Lord one
thousand eight hundred & sixty two (1862)

I Mary Clark do make and publish a codicil to
my last will & testament Now I give devise & bequeath to my
son Martin Clark all the money which may accumulate out
of my estate after my two children Mary & Peter Clark shall
have been educated in a suitable manner according to their
Station in life Mary to go to school until she completes her edu-
cation and Peter to go to school until he arrives at the age of
seventeen Also said two children Mary & Peter shall be decently
supported and allowed to board in any respectable house which
they may choose In testimony I have hereunto set my hand
and seal to the said codicil January 14th 1862
