Michael Barschall's Will

The State of Georgia Muscogee County

I Michael Barschall being in good health and of sound and disposing mind and memory but knowing the uncertainty of human life do hereby make publish and declare the following as my last Will and Testament

Item 1st It is my will and I do direct that all my just debts shall be paid out of the monies collections and effects belonging to my estate

Item 2nd Having full confidence in the judgement prudence and discretion of my wife Josephine Barschall I do hereby constitute and appoint her the sole executrix of this my last will and testament and I do hereby give her full power and authority to manage my estate in such manner as shall in her judgement conduce to the best interests of herself and my children She shall have the power to sell any of the property either real or personal belonging to my estate or which may hereafter belong to it and her conveyance to the purchaser shall fully invest said purchaser with title to the same against the claims of my heirs She shall also have the power to purchase property of any kind whatsoever with the monies and effects of my estate and all property purchased by her shall be a part and inure to the benefit of my estate And it is my will that my said wife shall exercise these powers of her own will and judgement during the term of her widowhood without making any return whatever to any Ordinary or other Court

Item 3rd It is my wish and I do direct that my wife shall raise maintain and educate my children out of my estate and that they shall have such good and useful education as my property will warrant and their condition in life shall require And when any of my children shall marry or become of legal age it is my will that my wife shall advance to said child such a portion of my estate not exceeding an equal share as she may think proper keeping an account of the same and if my said wife shall deem it best the said property advanced to any child shall be loaned to said child the

little to said property remaining in my estate subject to final distribution among my children
In the event my said wife should marry it is my will that my estate shall be at once divided by commissioners to be appointed by the proper Court into equal portions so that my said wife and each of my children shall have one equal portion of the same share and share alike my wife to have a child's part and said Court shall appoint Guardians for my said children according to law And in case of the death of my wife without having been married then it is my will that my whole estate shall be equally divided among my children share and share alike

I Nathaniel Nuckolls of said State and County, being of sound mind and memory, and being of advanced age, and knowing that I must shortly depart this life, deem it right and proper that I should make a disposition of my property, do therefore make, publish and declare, this to be my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all Wills by me heretofore made.

Item 1

I desire and direct, that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner, in my new burial Lot in the Cemetery, of Columbus Ga., by the remains of my beloved Wife, and that the remains of my Son William T. Nuckolls, be removed to said Lot, I desire and direct, that said Lot be enclosed with an iron fence, and that Monuments be erected over the remains of my Wife, myself and my Son William, All to be suitable to our circumstances and conditions in life. My Soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it; as I trust and hope for eternal salvation through the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ.

Item 2

I desire and direct, that all my just debts be paid out of any moneys on hand, or collected or received from sale of any produce of my Plantation, or from any source of income of my Estate. If from now any unforeseen cause it may become necessary, to sell any property to pay my debts, I desire and direct, that my principal Executor select from all my property that which can best be spared & used for that purpose, so as not to interfere with the provisions, devises & bequests of this my Will.

Item 3

I hereby constitute and appoint my Sons, Thomas J. Nuckolls, Nathaniel A. Nuckolls, and James T. Nuckolls, and my Sons in law Robert B. Kyle and Henry Ware as Executors of this my last Will, and Testament.

Item 4

I constitute my Son, Thomas J. Nuckolls, as principal Executor with the special powers herein granted. In the event of his failure from any cause to act, then the next person named as Executor, to act in the capacity of principal Executor, and so in the order in which they are named.
