- Item 1st I desire my just debts to be paid
- Item 2^d I will & bequeath to my beloved wife Martha Perry one half of my negroes the negroes to be valued by disinterested appraisers and for her to make her own selection of one half in valuation and to retain one half of said negroes for and during the term of her natural life and at her death with this increase to pass to & become the property of my daughter Sarah W C Natt and her heirs
- Item 3rd As to all the residue of my estate real & personal of which I am now possessed or of which I may die seized & possessed I will & bequeath the same whether it consist of lands personal property or choses in action in fee to my daughter Sarah W C Natt and her heirs
- Item 4th I appoint my beloved friend & son-in-law Niles Natt executor of this my last will & testament This April 3^d 1851

Charles Cleghorn's Will

 I Charles Cleghorn knowing the uncertainty of life, do make certain publish & declare this my last will and testament as follows to wit

1 I hereby appoint my friend Robert Bass the executor of this my will and direct & empower him to pay my debts and then to divide the balance of my property into three shares or parcels, without sale making the shares as nearly equal as practicable

2 I further will & direct that my executor upon such division turn over one of said shares to my wife Elizabeth W Cleghorn to be held & enjoyed by her during her natural life

3 I further will & direct my executor to turn over one other of said shares to my friend John Bass to be held by him upon trust & confidence to wit to permit my son Samuel Cleghorn to receive the annual profits of the same for the term of his natural life and at his death to convey the same to his child or children and if he should die without a child to convey the same to my daughter or her representatives

4 I further will & direct my executor to have over the other of said shares to my daughter Sarah C Cleghorn to be held & enjoyed by her in her own right & if she should die without child or children then to vest in my son Samuel or his representatives

5 I further will & direct that upon the death of my wife the share which I have bequeathed to her for her life shall be equally divided between my son Samuel and my daughter Sarah or their representatives Signed sealed published and declared by the testator in the presence of the subscribing witnesses and subscribed by the witnesses in the presence of the testator & in the presence of each other this 28th of February 1861
