

Will of Moses Taylor

I Moses Taylor of said County & State of sound
and disposing mind and memory do make pub-
lish and declare this my last Will and Testament.

Item 1st I devise that all my just debts be paid

Item 2nd I will bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Margaret
Taylor all my real estate and lands in Muscogee Coun-
ty and State aforesaid owned and possessed by me ex-
cept such as may be otherwise disposed of under this will
I also will give and bequeath to my beloved wife Margare-
t Taylor all the personal property of every character
and nature and description that I may own and dis-
posed of, except the same may be otherwise dispos-
ed of under this my will

Item 3rd I will bequeath and devise to Mrs Christiana Ruder the
mother of my wife who has rendered faithful service
to me in sickness and in health all that portion of
the lands belonging to me lying East of Taylors Creek
on both sides of the Macon & Columbus Road said
Taylors Creek to be the Western boundary of said land
separating it from the lands herein given to my wife
Margaret Taylor - containing about two hundred
acres of land more or less
I also give & bequeath to the said Mrs Christiana Ruder
one Gray horse

Item 4th I appoint my beloved wife Mrs Margaret Taylor Exec-
utrix of this my last will & Testament and direct
that she be required to give no bond for the performen-
ce of her trust.

my hand and seal this fourteenth day of January one
thousand Eight hundred & seventy Eight.

Munro to me personally known who upon being duly sworn depose & say that they were present when Moses Taylor, then in life but now deceased, executed the foregoing instrument of writing bearing date the 14th day of January 1878, that said Moses Taylor published and declared the same to be his last will and testament and signed his name thereto in the presence of Deponents, who at the request of the said testator subscribed their names thereto as witnesses, in his presence, and all in the presence of each other. And Deponents further say that said Moses Taylor was of sound and disposing mind & memory and that the act was done without any undue influence or compulsion so far as they know or believe.
