 to all to whom these presents shall come - Greeting

Muscogee County Wills
 1862-1878
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Know Ye that on the sixth day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred & sixty five the last will and testament of Clement Pace late of said County deceased was exhibited in open court and in common form of law proved & admitted to record a copy of which is herewith annexed and administration of the estate real & personal of said deceased was granted to Elkanah Pace the Executor in & by said will named & appointed he having first taken the oath and performed all other requisites required by law in & by order of said Court & by virtue of these presents legally authorized to administer the estate real & personal of the said deceased according to the tenor & effect of the said will & testament according to law And he is hereby required to render a true and perfect inventory of all the estate both real & personal of the said deceased and have the same appraised & returned to this Court according to law and to render a true & correct account to the said Court of his actings & doings yearly and every year until this administration is fully completed.

1 Item I desire & direct that my body be buried in a decent & christian like manner suitable to my circumstances & condition in life My soul I trust shall return to the God who gave it

2 Item I desire & direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my executors herein after named & appointed as I am unwilling my creditors should be delayed in their rights

3 Item I give & bequeath to my beloved son William M Hoster five dollars

4 Item I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Rebecca A Hyatt five dollars

5 Item I give & bequeath to my beloved daughter Caroline S Cash all the personal property of which I am now or may be possessed at the time of my death both personal and real household and kitchen furniture notes accounts and money to her own proper use benefit & behoof for ever without reserve or limitation

6 Item I hereby constitute & appoint my beloved daughter Caroline S Cash Executor and my worthy friend Bessant D Barnes Executor of this my last will & testament this December 4th 1865 Nancy Hoster (L.S.)

I Heinrich Fischbacher of said county & State being of full health but of sound & disposing mind & memory and deeming it proper to make some disposition of my property do make publish and declare this my last will & testament

Item 1. As my dear unfortunate wife Hannah Fischbacher is at present incapacitated from mental derangement for managing any portion of my estate which otherwise I would gladly bequeath to her I hereby direct my executors or whoever shall have the management of my estate to provide for her and I do give & bequeath to her a suitable support & maintenance during her natural life or during her state of derangement said support & maintenance to be as ample for her comfort and welfare as my estate will allow due regard being had to the proper support maintenance & education of our three children who must also share with their mother in such support as my estate can afford and should my said wife ever permanently recover from her insanity then she is to have a one fourth part of all my estate real & personal

Item 2. Subject to the provision herein before made I leave all my estate real & personal in the hands of my executors herein after named the same to control sell out sell or otherwise dispose of and generally to manage as
