 this to be my last will and testament hereby revoking

Item 2nd I give bequeath & devise to my beloved wife Estlin
 Huff the place and Champion place containing about
 two hundred acres of land with all the appurtenances
 thereto belonging - one good horse buggy or mule instead
 of horse if preferred - two cows and calves two sows & pigs
 two beds of furniture one sewing machine with a suffi-
 cient quantity of household & kitchen furniture for her
 use also a sufficient amount of provisions for herself
 and the live stock hereby bequeathed to her for the space
 of twelve months - also the sum of two hundred dollars
 in money - Provided my said wife shall accept the
 bequest & devise contained in this item in lieu of dower
 and not otherwise
