To all whom it may concern - Whereas on the 19th day of July in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred & sixty six the undersigned being at the boarding house of Patrick Mc Mahan in the city of Columbus in the State of Georgia where the said Patrick was then sick of which sickness he died on the same day and the said Patrick Mc Mahan did then & there call the attention of the subscribers to what he was then about to say concerning his worldly goods & effects the same being his will for the disposition thereof where he went on to say in substance that he wished James O'Connor & John Dannelly to act as his Executors and that he wished his said Executors to sell his cotton and other little effects and out of the proceeds thereof to pay his debts and the remainder thereof to be given to his only child James Mc Mahan
