1st Item

I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner; suitable to my circumstances and condition in life. My soul I trust shall return to rest with God, who gave it, as I hope for eternal salvation through the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ

Item 2^d

I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my Executors hereinafter appointed as I am unwilling my creditors should be delayed in their rights.

Item 3^d

I give bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Margaret, the house and lot on which we ^{now} reside with all the rights and appurtenances in any way belonging. I also give to my beloved wife Margaret everything of which I am possessed, or may hereafter possess, real or personal, to have and enjoy forever. Having full and

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in my wife. I give her all my worldly goods in the simple feeling assured that she will see to the proper support and maintenance of my minor children - at the death of my wife, the goods real and personal of which I now possess to be disposed of, by will or and as she may see proper. I desire that my beloved wife Margaret, and I hereby appoint her my sole Executrix. I further desire that she be not amenable to any Court of law looking to her management of my Estate, which by this will vests in her - but that she shall do with it as she sees proper without entering into bonds for an Executrix, or obtaining orders of Court for the sale of my property - This my last Will and testament this May 6th 1872
