I Stephen McLaughlin, of said County and State, being of sound and disposing mind & memory, and being desirous of settling my worldly affairs whilst I have the ability & power to do so, do hereby make, publish & declare this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking & making null & void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made

Item First It is my will & I do hereby direct, my Executors herein after named and appointed or the survivor of them to have my body decently interred after my death

Item Second It is my will & I do hereby direct & instruct my Executors herein after named appointed or the survivor of them, as soon as practicable after my death, to take possession of all my property effects, real and personal, of which I may die seized & possessed

of, and all the same, and with the proceeds thereof pay all my just debts, including the expenses of my last illness and funeral.

Item Third All the rest, residue and remainder of my property whom reduced to money as directed in by said last item, I do hereby give, devise and bequeath unto the Reverend John Kirsch, Pastor of the Roman Catholic Church of the Holy Family of Columbus Georgia in case said Rev. John Kirsch is not the Pastor of said Church at the time of my death, then to his successor as such Pastor, to be used for the sole and benefit of said Church of the Holy Family of Columbus Georgia.

Item Fourth I do hereby nominate, constitute & appoint my friends Mr. W. Duckham & Michael McCleary, the Executors of this my last will and testament,

In Witness whereof, I the said Stephen McLaughlin, have set my hand & seal this the 10<sup>th</sup> day of March A.D. 1882.
