I, Stephen McLaughlin, of said County and State, being of sound and disposing mind & memory, and being desirous of settling my worldly affairs whilst I have the ability & power to do so, do hereby make, publish & declare, this to be my last will and testament, hereby revoking & making null & void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made

Item First

It is my will & I do hereby direct, my Executors hereinafter named and appointed or the survivor of them, to have my body decently interred after my death.

Item Second

It is my will & I do hereby direct, I trust my Executors hereinafter named & appointed, or the survivor of them, as soon as practicable after my death, to take possession of all my property & effects, real and personal of which I may die seized & possessed

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of, and sell the same, and with the proceeds thereof pay all my just debts, including the expenses of my last illness and funeral.

Item Third. All the rest, residue and remainder of my property, when reduced to money as directed in my said last item, I do hereby give, devise and bequeath unto the Reverend John Kiroch Pastor of the Roman Catholic Church of the Holy Family of Columbus Georgia or in case said Rev John Kiroch is not the Pastor of said Church at the time of my death, then to his successor, as such Pastor, to be used for the sole use & benefit of said Church of the Holy Family of Columbus Georgia.

Item Fourth. I do hereby nominate, constitute & appoint my friends Mr W. S. Hedham & Michael McCalley, the Executors of this my last will and testament,
