Item 1st It is my will, that all my just debts be paid,

Item 2nd I give unto my son Frank Philips the sum of one dollar and desire my Executor to pay it to him as soon as possible.

Item 3rd After the payment of all my just debts, and the payment to Frank Philips my son of one dollar, I give, devise and bequeath unto my two sons Charles and Ethelinda Philips, to be divided equally between them two, all the remainder of my property of whatever kind, real or personal, all stocks, money, all notes given by any person or persons whatever.
