Muddack who being duly sworn, saith that on the 13th of August 1866 he saw Daniel Griffin late of Muscogee County deceased sign seal declare & publish the above & foregoing as & for his last will & testament that at the time he was of sound & disposing mind & memory that he executed the same freely & voluntarily & of his own accord without any coercion compulsion or other influence that deponent subscribed the same as a witness at request of the testator in his presence & in the presence of the other three witnesses to wit R. Carter A. H. Chappell & Geo. S. Morton & that he saw said three witnesses subscribe the same as such in like manner with this deponent R. B. Muddack

1st Item I desire that all my just debts be paid as they respectively fall due

Item 2^d I leave to my daughter Asabel so much money as will amount principal & interest to the first money which I owe her being a legacy left to her by her

matter and for the absolute security of this I hereby give her a lien upon the lots & Buildings ^{Muscogee County Wills 1862-1875} lots 178, 179, 219, 220, the same being known as ^{www.georgiapioneers.com} the ~~Marine Bank~~ Building recently purchased by me from the Marine Bank of Georgia but in no event shall this sum & its accumulations so secured exceed the amount which my other children will receive under this will

Item 3^d The remainder of my estate real & personal I wish disposed of by my Executor as he may deem advisable including the property named in the second item & after paying Asabel the amount due her by me as Trustee I desire that the rest of my estate be divided share & share alike among my wife & children but should the shares of my wife & other children except Asabel not be equal to the amount received by her under item 2^d then she is to take nothing by the division under this item but if the amount received by her should be less than she would receive under the division she shall then receive so much as would make her share equal to the others

And for the purpose of carrying out this will I hereby nominate my son William Urquhart my executor and desire he shall undertake the administration without Bond or security always remembering that he represents his father in his duties to his Mother & brothers & Sisters

The State of Alabama In the name of God Amen Russell County I Rowena M Echols of the County and State aforesaid being of sound mind and memory and considering the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life do therefore make ordain publish and declare this to be my last will and testament that is to say after all my just debts are paid the residue of my estate both real and personal I give and bequeath as follows

First I give and bequeath to my sister Mrs Anna E Thomas the following negro slaves Thomas and his wife Jane and their children Charles Mary Fanny Dan infant child also the negroes Henry Simon & Jim also Gypsy (Anny's daughter & Betty's sister) also the negro woman Filly & her son John to have and to hold the said negro slaves and their increase to her the said Anna E Thomas her heirs & assigns & legal representatives forever

Secondly I give and bequeath to my sister in law Mrs Anabella Lockhart the following negro slaves Bulcan Martha Mack & Linda & their child Popsy George and his wife Little Marna and their children Kate John Rose & infant child also Harriett to have & to hold the said Negro slaves & their increase to her the said Anabella Lockhart and her heirs assigns and legal representatives forever

Thirdly I give and bequeath to my sister Mrs Cornelia Hudson the following negro slaves Jake and Rose Little Mary and her son Carter Rob & his wife Tyra and their children Abrama Nancy and Becky also Judy and his sister Big Maria to have and to hold the said negro slaves and their increase to the said Cornelia Hudson her heirs assigns and legal representatives forever

Fourthly I give and bequeath to my sister Mrs Ellen J Berstille the following negro slaves Dave and his wife Lucy Jesse and his wife Amanda and their children Washington Frederick & Samuel also Fati and her son Mingo
