

In the name of God I Am I Alexander Bennett
write in body but of sound mind and memory, calling to mind
the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appertain-
unto all men to die, do make and declare this my last will
and testament, and first I give and bequeath my soul to
God who gave it, and my body to the earth to be buried at
the discretion of my friends, and as to such earthly substance
whatever it may be leave God to dispose of it as
I have by just Do my beloved Wife Nancy Bennett
I give and devise to her following tract of land inclu-
ding the dwelling house beginning on the old boundary
line of former Jasper County, and running with the same
on the east leading to Hoggs old Mill until the fence
between the ranch thence with the ranch to Saml. Marks
dying thence with said line to Perry's house thence with
Perry's line to Nelson's line thence with Nelson's line to
the opposite side boundary line, thence with said line to
the beginning containing one hundred and twenty five
acres more or less, to have and to hold the said property dur-
ing her life, and at her death to be equally divided among
all my children, I also give my beloved Wife two negroes viz
George and Simey, a foal mare, two cows and calves and
one bull, a sow and eight pigs, fine sheats, and six heddles
beside her choice out of the whole lot, fine sheep, all my
crop of every thing made on the plantation the present
year, all my household and kitchen furniture, Sycamore &
oakle & two sets of my best farming tools, to hold the same
thence to be divided as the land.

Second, To my beloved daughter Elizabeth I give and
bequeath a negro girl named Caroline a slave till the youngest,
and one hundred dollars, a cow and calf, a bea and a furniture
and ornaments焉焉

Third, To my dear children, Mary, Lizzie, Francis
Sarah, Sarah Linsford, Anna Houghins, Amelia Howell,
Amelia Gibson & William Bennett, I give and bequeath
the ten following negroes viz Paine, Green, Julia &

her two children, Harriet & Jenny, Louisa, Turner Jeff, Adolphus
Howell, to be equally divided between the seven children aforesaid,
in any way they may agree upon. The balance of land, stock,
horses and plantation tools, and every thing else not hereby disposed
of, after the payment of my debts, to be equally divide among
my eight children share & share alike.

To my dear Daughter Amelia Howell I give ten dollars to
be take out of the proceeds of the land, stock &c before
the division, — I constitute and appoint William Gibson &
William Bennett my Executors of this my last Will and
Testament, and now revoking all former Wills by me at any
time heretofore made, I declare this to be my last Will and
Testament, as witness my hand and seal this twentieth day
September 1845
