declare and publish this my last will & Testament

First I Command my feeble body to the dust whence it
Came and my soul to the hands of my Creator—
In making be disposition of such worldly effects as
I have I it in my will & desire first the tract of
land upon which I now reside being part of three
lots I am Coheir to Parley Joseph Parley & and
Ephraim Heard and the their heirs to be divided
or sold as a majority of them may deem proper
Second the 4th of the 122 and hundred & twenty two and 123 of the
district I give to the legal representatives of William
Loring and to the same representatives of Caleb
Loring and to be equally divided & not executed
hereafter named &c

Third I give to Benjamin & John and his heirs the
tract of land of 100 acres of land of William Andrew
and his heirs.

Fourth I give to my son George Parley and his heirs the
sum of money to be paid to Little Anthony, Eddy, Stephen,
John and John and their heirs &c
Fifth I give to my son Joseph Parley one hundred
dollars of the same money to be paid to his heirs
Sixth I give to a certain negro named Little Anthony
the sum of one hundred Dollars to be paid
to be paid by my legal representatives as soon as
they can conveniently do— I hold some note made
by Thomas Richards and Joseph Heard which I wish
to be depend on as justice and I wish all my
just debts to be paid— I give my youngest son
John & Parley of the same of one hundred & thirty dollars
to be paid to him at the age of twenty one years which
is to remain in the hands of Benjamin & John Parley or his
heirs the same money to be paid to John & Parley
wherefore which is not to be paid until an equal
share of the same

William, & Susan Elizabeth & John Taylor children of my son
*Edward the dec. The sum of One Hundred dollars be in
in the hands of my son Joseph.

A bill of sale of the above named stock if any together with
the number of my personal property which to be divided
among my four children and amongst the legal repre-
sentatives of each as William Taylor dec. & Susan & Susan
James Bailey & the legal heirs of each Taylor, dec. &
Susan Taylor, & Benjamin H. Bailey.

Having paid to my son Joseph the most of the four
hundred dollars in this will specified for the negro-
es & having I wish my after named executors to come
into court and said son Joseph to pay the balance
of the said paid then and collect to him.

I hereby nominate & appoint my sons Joshua Bailey, Ben-
jamin & Susan executors to this will but will not retain
powers hereby granting & cancelling all other & former
powers of mine making.
