 Colman then in life made the following nuncupative
 will to wit, during her last illness, in the

 daughter Nancy Langford to receive from my estate
 One Hundred Dollars, and the balance of
 my Estate I want divided equally between
 Nancy, Gwinn and Cornelia Butts, and also
 one feather bed to Cornelia Butts, and I want
 George Ellam paid seventeen Dollars which I am
 due him, and that I want the land drawn by
 me in the late Cherokee purchase, sold for the
 benefit of my children — And I want Oliver
 Gwinn to execute my will.

 and Oliver Gwinn, who after being duly sworn
 deposed and said that the above nuncupative
 will made by Elizabeth Colman late of said
 County, Geo. is true in substance, and that at
 the time thereof she was of sound mind disposing
 mind and memory, and that she did the
 same freely without compulsion and that the same
 was made during her last illness, and that she has
 since departed this life.
