 shortly ^{perish} ~~die~~ ^{depart} leave this world and therefore both as respects my
 my family and myself that I should make a disposition of
 my property and estate as a kind Providence has blessed me, so
 that I have made this my last Will and Testament, hereby do
 declare, and thus make the same.

1st Item I desire and direct that my body be buried in
 a decent and Christianlike manner suitable to my circum-
 stances in this my last Will, that I desire to rest with
 God and his people, and also for eternal salvation through
 the merits and atonement of the blessed Jesus and I have
 given hereby, where I have given my property, and as I have
 by this, intended for my own good.

2^d Item I desire and direct, that all my last debts
 be paid, without delay, by my executors, and I am
 willing that my estate should be delayed in their debts,
 separately as that be no necessity of delay.

3^d Item I give and bequeath to my beloved son James
 D. Johnson, my and mine, his natural life, forty my negro
 woman Fanny, about eight years of age, my negro girl, named
 social also about of age, and my negro man, named Sam,
 about fourteen years of age, and one half of the household
 and kitchen furniture.

4th Item The wife named Mary, named Hannah,
 and Christopher, and the son John D. Johnson
 during his natural life after my estate therein is over. I
 give beneath and under to my grand daughter Maria
 Whalley Frances Whalley, and Henrietta Whalley, and my
 grand sons Augustus Whalley, and Stephen Whalley,
 and also the children of my son James D. Johnson, if he
 should have any, and have children.

5th Item I desire and direct, that my son James D.

Johnson, may if he prefer it, instead of having the above named negroes
 during his natural life, have the value of said negroes
 paid, and pay the remaining two thirds to my executors and agents
 appointed for the benefit of my above named grand children, Maria
 Frances, Henrietta, Augustus and Stephen Whalley.

6th Item I desire and direct, that the above named negroes
 be allowed to choose with whom they will live, and may, may, and
 not remain slaves.

7th Item I desire and direct, that my beloved son
 James D. Johnson and my worthy friend W. H. Adams, and
 if they may feel well and convenient, take 1st March 1849.
