and bequeath unto Sarah my wife, one Servel
Horse, one Cig, Five beds & bedsteads and furni-
ture belonging to the same, one Refrs, one Ward,
one tea table, one folding table, one dressing table,
and Looking Glass, and six Rough Rotten Chairs.

For the love and affection I have for my son
William A. Luckie I give and bequeath unto
him the following, negro slaves (viz) Jack & Mary,
and Dicy, and two hundred and twenty five
dollars. To be paid out of the money arising
from the sale of the property hereinafter to be
disposed of.

For the love and affection I have for my son
Samuel A. Luckie, I give and bequeath unto
him the following, negro slaves (viz) Washington
and Sophia also one hundred and twenty
five Dollars, to be paid out of the money
arising from the sale of the property hereinafter
to be disposed of.

For the love and affection I have for my son
Alexander A. Luckie, I give and bequeath
unto him the following, negro slaves (viz) Loe,
Wheat Tiller and Tabbitha, also one hun-
dred and twenty five dollars to be paid out
of the money arising from the sale of the
property hereinafter, to be disposed of.

For the love and affection I have for my
daughter Mary Ann Pace, I give and
bequeath unto her, Nathaniel Luckie

the following negro slaves viz Jane Kate Elmina
Elizabeth, Phoebe James and Croy.

For the use and enjoyment of and for my daughter
Lucie E. Williams, I give and bequeath her the
following, namely negro slaves viz Lucy, Henry
Mary, and Rebecca and I shall also
pay fifty five dollars to be paid out of the money
arising from the sale of the property hereinafter
to be disposed of. It is my Will and desire
that all the property not herein conveyed away
be otherwise disposed of, be sold, and after
paying my debts unto the legacies in money—
I bequeath to my sons William & Luckie Samuel
& Leath & Elizabeth, & Luckie, and daughter
Lucie E. Williams the money, and other evidences
of debt arising from the sale thereof, to be
equally divided between my wife Jane
Elizabeth, William & Luckie, Samuel & Luckie,
Elizabeth & Luckie, Mary Ann Pace, &
Lucie E. Williams.

I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint
my son William & Luckie, Elizabeth & Luckie
— executors of this Will, and of the same
last of this and last, and hereby revoking
all former Wills and testaments, at any time
heretofore by me made, and do subscribe
this to be my last Will and testament,
in witness whereof, I have at the bottom of
the so called sheet of this my Will (the whole
being included in two sheets) subscribed my
name, and affixed my seal the sixteenth day
of December in the year of our Lord One
Thousand Eight hundred and thirty five
